




#### PMC RECYCLING PROGRAM

### UNLOCK UNUSED CIRCULAR POTENTIAL OF POST-CONSUMER WASTE STREAM







It is estimated that the annual consumption of clothing material on paper machines throughout Europe is substantial. The majority of it is incinerated. The utilisation of these 7,000 tons as raw material is a potential avenue for exploration.



- 1. Replace virgin materials in new products
- 2. Provide a steady and reliable material stream
- 3. Guarantee material properties and quality











### FACING THE END-OF-LIFE REALITY OF PAPER MACHINE CLOTHING



- No Packaging Standard
- Several Manual Treatments
- Hard to move without machine or crane
- Ends up as general waste



# THE CENTRAL FOCUS OF THE RECYCLING PROGRAM IS TO INTEGRATE SEAMLESSLY INTO THE PAPER MILL'S EXISTING OPERATIONS

- User Research to understand the process of disposing old PMCs
- Integrate take-back in existing disposal process
- Individual onboardings







### WE'RE TAKING IT ALL BACK | FORMING FABRICS AND PRESS FELTS FROM ALL BRANDS



- Not limited to products from ANDRITZ
- Recycling for products from all manufactures
- Starting with Forming Fabrics and Press Felts (about 70% of the waste)
- Dryers shall be included in the future




#### LEGALLY SOUND FROM COLLECTION TO RECYCLING TO REPORTING BACK TO THE PAPER MILL

### TRANSPARENCY AND TRACEABILITY – ALL IN ONE DOCUMENT




- Details about the waste that was picked up
