Ethylene oxide incident



Sept. 2020

First RASFF alerts about the presence of residues of EtO in sesame seeds.
 Contaminated products (or final products derived thereof) must be withdrawn/recalled

June 2021 RASFF alerts affecting food additives and end-products where they were used. Alternative solutions to manage the incident were not accepted by EC legal services

Oct. 2021

• EC+MS meeting on Regulatory and Technical Aspects

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- EFSA: assessment of 2-chloroethanol
- EC+MS new meeting on Regulatory and Technical Aspects



Process contaminants

Acrylamide



- Stakeholder consultation is imminent:
 - review of existing BMLs established by Reg. (EU) 2017/2158
 - new BMLs for rösti, other potato-based dishes (heated in oven or frying) (including potato croquettes), root and tuber vegetable fries, oxidized black olives, fruit crisps/chips, vegetable crisps other than potato and cereal crisps, onion processed, cocoa powder
 - establishment of MLs
- Question on biscuits and rusks "marketed for infants and young children" comes back (EP objection)

3-MCPDE/GE



➤ Reg. 2020/1322 sets MLs for 3-MCPDE and GE for: vegetable oils, fish oils and oils derived from other marine organisms, infant formula, follow-on formula and young child formula

➤ Possible setting of MLs for finished products (in addition to the MLs established by Reg. 2020/1322)

Mineral oils

Mineral oils



- > EFSA mandate for an updated risk assessment:
- occurrence data (mid 2021); final opinion (end of 2022)
- National activities (Germany):
- Notification of a German "Mineral oil ordinance" (food contact materials) that obliges to use a functional barrier against mineral oils in the production / placing on the market of food contact materials and articles (FCM) made of waste paper
- Update of the German Benchmark values for mineral oil hydrocarbons (MOH) in foods

Regulatory measures expected on Ochratoxin A, and Fusarium toxins (DON, T-2/HT-2)

➤ For Ochratoxin A, review of existing MLs and addition of MLs for foodstuffs not yet included

For DON, T-2/HT-2 discussions continue. Challenges: extreme weather conditions, year-to-year and geographical variation, availability of prevention and mitigation tools


Other measures to be expected in 2022



- Monitoring recommendation on Alternaria (to be published)
- Monitoring recommendation on furans (to be published)
- MLs of mercury for fish and salt
- MLs of arsenic in certain foods
- MLs for perflourinated compounds in food
- Changes to the current legislation on dioxins
- Changes to the current legislation on aflatoxins
- Recast of Regulation 1881/2006
