Special observations	Status of Madeira & Azores Azores and Madeira, two groups of islands in the Atlantic Ocean, are an integral part of the Portuguese Customs territory. As such, ATA Carnets are accepted in both islands in the same way as in mainland Portugal. However, and although it is not a mandatory requirement expressed by Portuguese Customs, if a Carnet holder is travelling from either Madeira or Azores to mainland Portugal, it is recommended to add a set of blue transit sheets in the ATA Carnet to facilitate the procedures at Customs offices.
